HELPERS AND BETRAYERS

1. Many American prisoners of war, particularly airmen, have evaded capture in enemy occupied territory for varying periods prior to their apprehension. During this evasion they were in many cases aided by underground organizations, resistance movements, and friendly civilians. In order that these helpers may be suitably rewarded, it is desired that prisoners of war who have received such aid list herewith the names of such persons together with a brief explanation of the assistance provided. Example:

Pierre Durand, 19 Rue
Duret, Lyon, France

Provided food and shelter for
three weeks. Furnished civil-
ian clothes, 18 Mar 44.

2. Where full names and address are not known, give any information contributing to the identification of helpers.
Example:

Georges, Farmhouse 3
miles east of Jouy,
France. House built
of white stone.

Hid me for two days and put
me in contact with underground,
6 Jun 44. 5' 10", 155 lbs.

3. Some Americans are now prisoners of war because civilians in German occupied areas betrayed them. All possible information leading to the identity of such persons is desired in order that retributive action may be taken. Example:

Unknown, Brussels,
Belgium

Hid me and left, supposedly
to contact aid, but returned
with Gestapo, 15 May 44. 5' 8",
150 lbs., black hair, dark eyes,
extremely coarse voice, dressed
in what appeared to be an air
force leather flying jacket.
