1. It is requested that 2nd it. Milliam Fowell, 0-80837, 1010th Army Air Porces Rese Unit, Atlantic City, Now Jersey, be interviewed and that his testimony reparding war crises be taken under oath in question and enswer form, as indicated in prargarpha 6, 7, and 8 of the letter dated 2 June 1945 from the Commanding General, Army Service Forces, on the subject of "Interviews with Repartiates from Enery Territory re Emer Crisma."

The stiention of it. Rowall should be directed particularly to the alleged execution of a number of american and initial Air Force officers who were at Carp Buchemual and who were subsectives on or about 19 October 1944. Directed from a letter of Walter S. Special Agent, Oic, and a forwarding letter from the Staff Judge Advocate, 200, are inclosed to assist the examiner.

In view of the apparent importance of this matter, it is requested that this interrogation be expedited as much as possible.
