MEMORANDUM FOR THE OFFICER IN CHARGE:

1. In an interview on 19 July 1945, Lt. Raymond Wojnicz, 1420 Douglas Street, Racine, Wisconsin, was questioned regarding the alleged execution of a number of American and British air force officers at Camp Buchenwald on or about 19 October 1944. The Lt. stated that he was one of approximately 168 American and British officers, of whom from 60 to 80 were members of the U. S. Army, who were transferred by train from Camp Buchenwald to another camp at Stalag Luft III, Sagan, Germany. The men left Camp Buchenwald on 19 October 1944 and arrived at Stalag Luft III on 21 October 1944.

The Lt. believes that the impression may have arisen that these men were to be executed inasmuch as at the time they left Camp Buchenwald they were guarded by approximately 30 Gestapo guards, who met them at the prison gates and guarded them continuously until they arrived at Stalag Luft III. However, insofar as the Lt. knows, no British or American officers were executed and none were mistreated on this trip. Lt. Wojnicz gave the following names of men who were with him at Camp Buchenwald and were transferred to Stalag Luft III with him:
